'Modern Classicisms' Competition

To complement *The Classical Now*, King's College London and the Courtauld Institute of Art asked students and staff to share their own contemporary takes on the 'classical' – whether as something beautiful to celebrate, or something oppressive to interrogate and challenge.

The results showcase the creativity, originality and innovation of our shared academic community. 25 entries were received, and from students and staff alike: submissions drew on a range of media, including painting, drawing, film, photography, sculpture, music, textiles, poetry, illustrated story book, collage and computer game. The competition not only bridged King's and the Courtauld, but also brought together undergraduates, postgraduates and staff. It attracted submissions from across King's: the Chaplaincy, King's Business School and the Faculties of Life Sciences & Medicine and of Arts & Humanities.

A panel of judges – consisting of staff from King's and the Courtauld, as well as two artists – had the task of allocating the first, second and third prizes. All the winning entries, alongside a selection of other works, are displayed in Bush House Arcade and The Union Shop. 
